The downside of the latter is that things can then be shared without necessarily thinking about the potential consequences. It also highlights some of the potential dangers of social media both for children and us as adults. Some of the children were a little surprised when I went through the age restrictions for these sites. The majority are 13+ with WhatsApp having a minimum age restriction of 16.

The guide below gives a good summary of most of the main social media apps and I would really recommend having a read of this article called 'Is my child ready for social media?' It is particularly useful if your child is putting pressure on you to use one of these sites which may be because they themselves face peer pressure. It is 100% worth a read.
