# Other news this week

**Remembrance Day:** Weather permitting, we plan to walk down to the War Memorial next Friday morning and observe a period of silence at 11am. If the weather is not being kind, we will have an assembly at school.

We have various poppies and Remembrance Day items for sale. Our Year 6 selling team are on the playground each morning and after school should you wish to purchase something.

After School Clubs: Thanks to those who have signed up to one of the clubs on offer this half term. The Multi-Skills club is very low on numbers and we may not be able to run this in January, if we don't get more children signing up for it. Running after school clubs presents quite a challenge. We have relatively few staff (being a small school) and the pressures of modern school life means they have limited capacity. It means we have to draft in external providers, who make a charge. Our smaller pupil numbers means that the clubs generally have to be all ages (which puts some off) or more age specific, which means the numbers can end up so low that they become unviable.

I'm always happy to discuss the possibility of volunteers to run clubs. Please let me know if this may be of interest.

Black History Month: During the month of October, each teaching staff member led an assembly highlighting a black history hero. Some of the people featured included Barack Obama, Mae Jemison, Denise Lewis and Jack Leslie. The latter has been in the news of late as a statue has recently been unveiled outside of Plymouth's football stadium. Jack was one of the first black players in England and played for Argyle in the 1920's and 30's scoring 137 goals. In 1925 he was picked to play for England but the decision was reversed when the selectors were told about the colour of his skin.
