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# Other news this week

Attendance: The overall attendance for the year has just slipped below 96% this week. There has been a fair bit of illness around. **<u>SSSG fundraising update:</u>** In October 2023 a new committee was formed. The first fundraising event we held was a Halloween cake sale and then we started planning the Christmas Fayre and Christmas Raffle.

- The Christmas raffle made a profit of £314
- The Advent candles have made a profit so far of £36, there are still some candles available to buy ready for next year or as decorations.

The SSSG would like to thank everyone who helps with the setting up, running and cleaning up at events. A big thank you to everyone for supporting our events and thank you for all the donations - we would not be able to run the Secret Room without your kind donations.

The funds raised will be used towards the purchase of tablets for the children to use, and will fund children's first aid courses. The plan is for the first aid course to take place during school hours in the Summer Term.
