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Other news this week

<u>Attendance:</u> For the school year so far:

Teddy - 96.65%

Panda - 96.42%

Koala - 92.39%

This half term has been quite challenging in terms of attendance with quite a few children missing at various times with illnesses. Despite this, I am pleased to report that 16 children, 10 of whom are in Teddy class, have 100% attendance. One of them, Darcie in Year 1, has not missed a single day of school since she started at Shebbear in 2022!

In contrast, there are 12 children who have attendance below 90% so are regarded as being persistently absent. In some cases, attendance is rising and being in school every day for the rest of the school year will help this further.

Children who are under 90% attendance will have missed at least 10 days of school so far – so potentially in excess of 20 days (or over four school weeks) by the end of the summer term at this current rate. Put another way, that's 20 maths or English lessons missed! When it is put into this context, you can see why being in school as much as possible is so important.

<u>Parent Consultation Meetings</u>: These will take place during the week of the 11th March. More details will go out after half term so you can book a slot.

<u>Music Tuition:</u> We have been asked about the possibility of music tuition in school. As a result, we have arranged an assembly on Thursday 22nd when Ruth Hayes, a music teacher, will talk to the children about the possibility of learning a musical instrument. Following her visit, we will gauge interest and send out further details including costs.
